During lockdown I discovered St Paul's Cathedral Learning website. Here is the link to their learning library : <u>Our</u> <u>learning library</u> | <u>St Paul's Cathedral (stpauls.co.uk</u>) There are many different sections and the ones which interest me most are the talks from well-known theologians and clergy including Rowan Williams, Steven Cottrell and Paula Gooder.

In the learning library Dr Paula Gooder – Canon Chancellor of St Paul's Cathedral and a very well-respected theologian, hosts talks and interviews on a number of different topics. Most recently Paula's guest was Rev Kate Bottley. Kate is well known for her appearance on Gogglebox, Songs of Praise and her Radio 2 Sunday morning show with Jason Mohammad.

Kate spoke about her northern, working-class background, how not to be a church warden and her calling to be ordained. She describes how she felt she did not fit in at "vicar school" and how she views her ministry through the public platforms of TV and Radio. Her book – Have a Little Faith – expresses in real terms how her faith has helped and guided her through her ministerial life. Kate spoke in plain, down to earth language with a lot of humour, pathos, empathy and love for God. After her talk Kate answered a number of questions from the audience and in one of these answers to a question about whether you could have a little or a lot of faith – or whether you just had faith, she declares that there is "no one size fits all" when it comes to faith. People express their faith in different ways.

At Holy Trinity this is reflected in our different services. I believe it is important to not only think about "how" we express our faith, but also to express our faith and love of God in our daily lives. In our Gospel reading this week – John 15:9-17, Jesus tells his disciples that they have been chosen, so they can express God's love for them by obeying Jesus' final commandment to them.

In these troubled times when the outlook can be bleak, however we choose to express our faith, the one sure way of appreciating God's love for us is to love one another.

"Life on the Frontline" House Group Course

This May the Holy Trinity house groups (with the exception of "Growing Together" which will undertake the course in the autumn) will start running a six-week course entitled "Life on the Frontline" which aims to help equip us to become disciples of Christ in all areas of our lives. This course produced by the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity (LICC) encourages each of us to consider our frontline, which is the place where you spend much of your time, and where you meet people who don't know Jesus. It's the place to which God has called you, the place of possibility and potential for bringing the Good News.

We may be old or young, healthy or infirm, employed or not - but we all have a frontline - the place where God has put us to be Christ to others. The LICC in advertising the course asks each of us to "imagine what the impact might be on our neighbourhoods, workplaces, schools - on the whole nation - if we could help each other make a difference for Christ in these places. Imagine how God could work through you, right where you are."

Each session of the course combines a short video, discussion material, Bible teaching, and real-life stories of people who live their lives for Christ on their frontlines where the Lord has placed them. I want to encourage anyone who would like to do the course but is not currently in a house group, to consider joining a house group to benefit from this excellent teaching material.
