

Welcome to this week's edition of Holy Trinity News - Sunday 14th April 2024

Oddly, between Easter and Pentecost we read passages from Acts which gives an account of what happened at Pentecost and afterwards. Written by Saint Luke as a sequel to his Gospel, this is the story of the Holy Spirit as the engine behind the progress of the early Church from Jerusalem to Rome and, therefore, to the world and, therefore, to us.

From the 21st Century point of view, Acts is the most accessible book of the Bible because it writes about places where we might go on a Summer holiday; and it is also a graphic account of the way people struggle with faith, get into arguments and, against human inclination, show great courage. The book also tells us a great deal about the challenges of growth, the dangers of disunity and the need to maintain self-discipline. It is also full of gripping and inspiring stories.

After our intense journey from the crib to the Cross this is an excellent time to enjoy reading Acts and seeing where it can help us with our current wonderful challenges of growth.
