

Welcome to this week's edition of Holy Trinity News – Sunday 21st April 2024



25 years ago, Fi and I visited a botanical garden in Scotland, and growing in a glasshouse I found a variety of self-propagating succulent colloquially known as a "Mother of Thousands" because of the tiny plantlets which circle the leaves (see picture). Having been given a "Mother of thousands" as one of my first plants as a child, I collected a tiny plantlet from one of the leaves and subsequently grew my own plant at home.

Over the years I have periodically grown new plants from plantlets when the original "mother" plant has become straggly, so back in January as we prepared to move to Hurstpierpoint, I decided to discard the current "leggy" plant and collect a new plantlet to grow when we moved to the Rectory.

However, I quickly forgot about this during the move. Then over the Easter weekend I discovered on a window ledge the dried-up segment in a pot and, more in hope than expectation, planted it in freshly watered compost. And within 2 weeks a new plant "Mother of Thousands" descended from that original Scottish plant has started to grow.

Reflecting on this, I am reminded how the Christian faith passes from one generation to another from the "original" life of Christ. The story of the Acts of the Apostles tells how this process began, with new life in Christ passing from the Saviour to thousands of new believers within a very short time, and that faith has become our own as the story was passed on to us in turn. Our responsibility is to pass our faith on to future generations, but we know we do not always see the fruit of our labours and can get disheartened. However, I sensed the Lord encouraging us as I thought about the shrivelled plantlet "coming back to life." The seeds of faith sown in years gone by with friends and family may lie dormant for years, but the Holy Spirit can bring new life even where that appears unlikely. So may we be scatterers of seeds of faith this Eastertide and in the years to come, and continue to pray for those with whom we have shared Christ's story of salvation.

"Life on the Frontline" House Group Course

This May the Holy Trinity house groups (with the exception of "Growing Together" which will undertake the course in the autumn) will start running a six-week course entitled "Life on the Frontline" which aims to help equip us to become disciples of Christ in all areas of our lives. This course produced by the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity (LICC) encourages each of us to consider our frontline, which is the place where you spend much of your time, and where you meet people who don't know Jesus. It's the place to which God has called you, the place of possibility and potential for bringing the Good News.

We may be old or young, healthy or infirm, employed or not - but we all have a frontline - the place where God has put us to be Christ to others. The LICC in advertising the course asks each of us to "imagine what the impact might be on our neighbourhoods, workplaces, schools - on the whole nation - if we could help each other make a difference for Christ in these places. Imagine how God could work through you, right where you are." Each session of the course combines a short video, discussion material, Bible teaching, and real-life stories of people who live their lives for Christ on their frontlines where the Lord has placed them. I want to encourage anyone who would like to do the course but is not currently in a house group, to consider joining a house group to benefit from this excellent teaching material.
