Welcome to this week's edition of Holy Trinity News - Sunday 28th April 2024

Jesus loves a good party. He started his public ministry at a wedding at Cana where he saved the groom from the disgrace of running out of wine by turning water into wine. There are numerous accounts in the New Testament of his eating with friends, such as the siblings Lazarus, Mary and Martha who lived at Bethany. Sometimes he would invite himself for a meal as when he called Matthew the tax collector to follow him (Matt. 9.9-13). When Jesus spotted Zacchaeus in a tree he said '...hurry and come down, as I must stay at your house today' (Luke 10.1-10). Sometimes Jesus' parties were huge – there are accounts of his feeding 5000 and, at another time, 4000 people. Sometimes these gatherings were more intimate, with the Last Supper being the most significant. All these occasions had one thing in common – in addition to the fellowship they afforded, Jesus used them as an opportunity to teach people about the good news he brought, news of God's love and forgiveness.

Mothers' Union also likes a party, an opportunity to gather together to share food, fellowship and God's love.

One such occasion, the annual Charity Lunch, will take place on Saturday, 11th May at 12 noon in the Guide Hut. It is open to all – women, men and children. It's an opportunity for us to invite friends, family and neighbours. The charge is £10 (£4 children under 12). Proceeds will be given to support MU's overseas work, which includes literacy and financial training and advice on setting up a micro-business. Tickets can be obtained from members of MU – watch for the person with the clipboard on Sunday. I do hope to see you there.

"Life on the Frontline" House Group Course

This May the Holy Trinity house groups (with the exception of "Growing Together" which will undertake the course in the autumn) will start running a six-week course entitled "Life on the Frontline" which aims to help equip us to become disciples of Christ in all areas of our lives. This course produced by the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity (LICC) encourages each of us to consider our frontline, which is the place where you spend much of your time, and where you meet people who don't know Jesus. It's the place to which God has called you, the place of possibility and potential for bringing the Good News.

We may be old or young, healthy or infirm, employed or not - but we all have a frontline - the place where God has put us to be Christ to others. The LICC in advertising the course asks each of us to "imagine what the impact might be on our neighbourhoods, workplaces, schools - on the whole nation - if we could help each other make a difference for Christ in these places. Imagine how God could work through you, right where you are."

Each session of the course combines a short video, discussion material, Bible teaching, and real-life stories of people who live their lives for Christ on their frontlines where the Lord has placed them. I want to encourage anyone who would like to do the course but is not currently in a house group, to consider joining a house group to benefit from this excellent teaching material.
